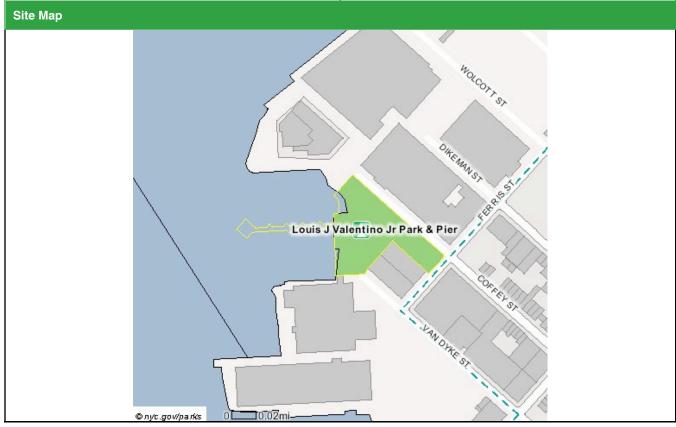
- 1. Enter the park from the south entrance.
